

# Census 2000 EEO Data Packet

## Dodge, Steele, and Waseca Counties

This table compiles 2000 Census data on the male, female, white and minority labor force by detailed occupation. The occupations are organized by Census Occupational Code (COC) and corresponding Standard Occupational Code (SOC). This table has been developed for use by Minnesota companies in completing an availability analysis and utilization/underutilization analysis.

### Table Notes:

- **COC** stands for Census Detailed Occupation Code.
- **SOC** stands for Standard Occupation Classification Code.
- **White** signifies White Non-Hispanic males and females.
- **Minority** signifies all other races including Black, Asian, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander (NHOPI), American Indian or Alaska Native (AIAN), Hispanics and Latino(a)s of all races, and individuals who identified as having more than one race or ethnicity.
- **Percentages** will not necessarily add up to 100%, due to rounding.  
(Examples: 56.67% + 42.22% = 98.89%; 36.68% + 63.73% = 100.41%)
- **If ‘#’** follows a job occupation name, this signifies that some of the name was left off. Please see the “Occupation Definitions” Document (found at <http://www.deed.state.mn.us/lmi/publications/aap.htm>) to see the complete name.
